### Cornucopia

For Freemasons, the Cornucopia is most commonly known as the symbol for the stewards stationed in the Masonic South. The Masonic South is tied with the nourishment of the brethren. Often one of the duties of the stewards is to help with meal preparation and other times when nourishment is provided to the members.

The Cornucopia symbolizes abundance and nourishment that stretches back to Classical Antiquity. It is most commonly associated with Zeus. When Zeus was born, he was hidden away by his mother to prevent Kronos, his father, from eating him, as he did Zeus' siblings. Kronos, in doing this, tried to avoid the fulfillment of a prophecy, stating that one of his children was destined to destroy him. While Zeus was in hiding from his father, he was fed and cared for by various divine attendants, including Amalthea (the Nourishing Goddess), who appeared in the form of a goat. The legend states Zeus accidentally broke off one of her horns. Later he gave the horn to man's world as it provided whatever was desired.

The world adopted Cornucopia as a symbol of prosperity and abundance. Several Central and South American countries are depicted on their coats of arms. In Canada, an annual festival called Cornucopia is held. In the United States, several states have the Cornucopia on their state flags and state seals. It is most closely tied in the United States with the Thanksgiving Holiday.

I hope by writing this, I provide you with education and nourishment until we meet again. However, I also hope to encourage you, remind you, and claim upon your kind offices that there are brethren among you that seek nourishment, more light.

Some of you have an abundance and have prospered, while others are still early in their journey and are rough ashlars but may not have all the tools or know how to use the tools of a Master Mason. Young masons need your good and timely counsel in the most tender way; I hope to see you in the lodge or study club.

As an appointed officer, it is my duty to serve the brethren of our lodge. I endeavor as the Senior Steward to serve you now and in due time in more significant ways. Allow me to serve you in such a manner that leaves our lodge much like the Cornucopia, the symbol of my station, overflowing with the fruits of our labor that all the brethren may enjoy. Please let me know how I may be of service to you and your families.
